A continuing problem in the Gillham Main area is a very few people who are putting out trash about the middle of the week.

By the time 4 or 5 days have passed dogs, cats and wild animals such as rats and possums have torn the bags apart and scattered it about the neighborhood.

FREE Large Item Pickup

The City trash service will pick up items that are too heavy or too large to fit in a regular garbage truck.
YOU MUST CALL TO ARRANGE THIS SERVICE.

Call 274-1811 to make the arrangements.

Basically they pick up items such as sofas, refrigerators, stoves, and other such things no longer of use to you.

SCHEDULE THIS SERVICE IN ADVANCE. They will be out the day they say they'll come. Usually this will be 1 to 3 weeks after you call. In the Gillham Main area this will usually be on a Tuesday.

In the last NEWSLETTER we suggested

locking autos and houses more securely as thefts from autos and cars made up 17 of 18 reported crimes in October.

In November only 8 of 16 total were thefts from autos or residences. But there were 8 crimes in four other categories.

Keep your eyes open and let's make this an even safer neighborhood.

Due to lack of money the Kansas City
School District is considering closing more schools. Possible closings at the end of this school year include: ROLLINS, WEST HIGH & MANUAL HIGH.

Many persons have been concerned about high school students on the streets, sidewalks, steps, and even front porches throughout the GILLHAM MAIN area.

If you have been coming to our meetings you have known how to deal with this for some time. But for those of you who haven't been able to attend recently ..

The Schools - under State Law - only have responsibility for students on school grounds. Once these students leave the school they are citizens with the same rights to use the sidewalks as the rest of us.

Both Westport and Manual High Schools have been contacted regarding this problem but there is little they can legally do. If you can provide names or photos some action may be possible.

Mr. Stroud is the Vice Principal at Westport High - 931-3439.

Mr. Meadows is the Principal at Manual - 531-4980.

If you observe a serious problem - too much congregation on your steps, vandalism a phone call to the Police Department 421-1500 will get an officer there quickly.

However, after all this with 2500 students some problems may continue.

TOO MANY UNITS

On Tuesday, December 28 the Kansas City Board of Zoning Adjustment had a case brought before it regarding 4322 Warwick (Case # 7365-A).
The City Codes Administrator had found

the property to be in violation of the Zoning Ordinance.

The City Staff Report found that only 2 of 6 units were legal and that the cars parked in the front yard were also in violation of parking requirements.

A lawyer representing the owner requested a 90 day continuance to have the zoning changed. The Board of Zoning Adjustment(BZA) denied the continuance and subsequently the appeal was withdrawn without a RZA ruling.

The two basic issues were 1) parking of vehicles in the yard, and 2) having more units

than the zoning permitted.



NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT REPORT

Many rumours, and questions have been heard by members of the Gillham Main Resident Advisory Committee.

A QUICK SUMMARY: Gillham Main asked for City \$\$ to make public improvements in our area. The City designated a "Neighborhood Improvement Program area" 35th to 45th, Main to Gillham. A committee was appointed by councilmen representing this area.

This committee saw the biggest problem to be dangerous sidewalks and decided which had

most need of repair.

The City took this list, surveyed the sidewalk, estimated how much could be done for \$75,000 and gave us the results to be done:

Locust Street 39th to 43rd Oak Street 39th to 45th 43rd Street Walnut to Locust 40th Street Walnut to Oak 41st Street Main to Walnut McGee to Oak

McGee Street 39th to 44th This is approximately where we are. We have been told (from the beginning) that the City will pay the initial cost, but that 50% of this cost will be repaid by the property owners into a hardship loan fund available for use in our area.

Well Done Neighbors!

In January 1977 with an assist from the cold weather we did it! Between 40th and 45th, from Main to Locust there were NO REPORTED RESIDENCE BURGLARIES for the entire month (The only area in Westport without any!)! With 3000 residential units in GILLHAM MAIN this is a record that won't be repeated too often, but it looks good as a goal.

All together there were only 8 reported crimes including 2 car thefts & 3 thefts of auto accessories (CB radios?).

One year ago, January 1976, there were

25 reported crimes.

One month ago, December 1976, there were 13 reported crimes in this area. BUT.

To keep crime down all of us need to continue our efforts to look out for our neighborhood.

CARS IN YARDS ARE ILLEGAL

City ordinance requires that cars not be parked in yards. This is a recurring problem in our neighborhood on almost every street. Warwick is the worst.

Particularly in front yards this is a blighting influence on the neighborhood.



YOU MUST CALL TO ARRANGE THIS SERVICE.

Call 274-1811 to make the arrangements.

Basically they pick up items such as sofas, refrigerators, stoves, and other such things no longer of use to you.

SCHEDULE THIS SERVICE IN ADVANCE. They will be out the day they say they'll come. Usually this will be 1 to 3 weeks after you call. In the Gillham Main area this will usually be on a Tuesday.

FLY - By - Night Unincorporated offers cheap bargains in sidings, painting, pest controls, roofing, & so forth...

Don't get caught with poor quality materials and workmanship on your property. Be very cautious about offers to work on your home by telephone, mail, or door-to-door solici-tation. If you want work done talk to your neighbors and find out who did their work. Check the telephone book and ask the people in your hardware store.

CARS IN YARDS ARE ILLEGAL

Crime Prevention in OUR Neighborhood

Gillham Main residents have worked hard for the last four years and the results were most evident in January of this year when our efforts combined with the cold weather produced a month with NO reported residence burglaries.

With about 3000 residential units in our neighborhood we have gone from near 20 residential burglaries in a month to 0, 4, 4 for the last three months.

But this will continue only if we all stay alert for possible crimes.
PARTICIPATE FOR A SAFE NEIGHBORHOOD

Following is a brief summary of the crime prevention programs you can and should participate in:

What is Block Watching?

Watch & listen for strangers, strange cars, strange noises, etc. Call the Police at 421-1500 to check them out

WHISTLESTOP

Carry a whistle with you always. Blow it in an emergency. Call the police 421-1500 if you hear a whistle blow. Buy whistles at cost at J & G Market, 43rd & Oak.

OPERATION IDENTIFICATION

Engrave your social security number on your belongings - put a decal on the door. Check out an engraver at Westport Public Library.

LIGHTS ON

Help light up your neighborhood. Leave a light on - inside & out. Criminals don't like to work where they can be seen.

HOME SECURITY CHECK

Call the Police Dept. at 842-6525 and ask for a free Home Security Check. Make sure you have done what you can to make it difficult and time consuming for a potential burglar to break into your home.

> RIDE ALUNG

Arrange to ride in the police car that patrols our neighborhood. Call Police Dept. at 842-6525/South Patrol to make arrangements.

ATTENTION LANDLORDS:

You can do much for crime prevention in the neighborhood.

According to the police most burglaries in every neighborhood are caused by people who live in the neighborhood.

When a neighborhood reduces the crime rate and is a safer place to live it is easier to rent at the prices you want.

- 1) Check out carefully references;
- 2) Try to respond to your neighbors concerns
- 3) Maintain your buildings so your tenants will want to stay
- 4) Change the locks or the tumblers in the locks when tenants change
- 5) Consider locked exterior doors to reduce breakins in your buildings
- 6) Cut away shrubs that cover up doors and windows
- 7) Put in and use exterior lighting

Many of the above cost you money but a secure building can command a higher rent.

AND neighbors and current tenants will reccomend a well maintained secure building over one that is not.

Old Car in Yard

The city hauls away junk cars for Free. Call 274-2521 to make arrangements.

Abandoned Vehicle

City ordinance permits the city to haul away any car left on a city street for more than <u>48</u> hours without being moved. If you suspect that someone has dumped their old clunker in front of your house or if any car has been parked a while without being moved call 421-1500 (the Police Dept.) and report the cars. You might even be helping in the recovery of a stolen auto.



REVENUE SHARING GRANT STATUS REPORT (NIP) by Jim Watt Chairman, Resident Committee

Since our last update to you in the March '77 NEWSLETTER, our committee has had some tough decisions to make.

FIRST, from the beginning of April thru the middle of July we were waiting to see if we could get another federal grant to pay for curbs while we would use our original grant for sidewalks. However, as we learned last month, our 2nd request was not approved.

NEXT, since the city administration changed its policy regarding the curb and sidewalk funding formula, we had to make a decision as to how to comply with the new policy while at the same time, please our councilmen, and be fair with you, the residents and property owners in Gillham Main.

This decision did not come overnight! Much deliberation was spent by our committee members to come to a realistic decision.

It is the decision of the committee by a majority vote to spend our grant on Warwick Blvd. only!

The work area is from 45th North to an intersection as far as the money will go. This may be 39th St. or it could be 36th St. As soon as the city staff lets us know we will pass the information on in the NEWSLETTER.

The work to be paid for 100% by the grant includes:

A. Curb & gutter removal & replacement;
B. Driveway approaches;
C. Corner radii.

The work to be paid for 100% by property owners is:

A. Sidewalk removal & replacement only! This 100%/100% funding formula is the latest policy change from the city admin-

The committee decided to concentrate our first grant on one street only.

Warwick was selected because ...

1. It is the most heavily traveled street in the neighborhood.

2. Curbs are non-existant in many blocks.

3. Our councilmen preferred it.

4. The committee expects the visibility impact to be in our favor with city hall should we apply for a future grant. The priority list published in the March

'77 NEWSLETTER is hereby rescinded.

No other curb & sidewalk work in the neighborhood will take place without prior advance notice given to our neighborhood association by the city.

Main As A Shopping Area What Is The Future Of 39th &

Hi there, again...We are trying the question-naire just one more time to remind you how important shopping/commercial areas are to adjacent residential neighborhoods.

Along with 3 times as many responses the second time around (from 4 up to 12 and this time?) we have a letter giving credit for a "decent questinnaire"(!) and one complainning

about assumptions.

A little background: Westport is generally defined as following the city limits of Westport when it was annexed to Kansas City 31st to Brush Creek & State Line to Troost. These have been the boundaries recognised by the Westport Community Council since its 1946 incorporation. While there are definitely problems with Troost - prostitution, crime, disreputable businesses, etc. there is also a Troost-Midtown Assn. that is beginning to turn the area around. Property values are holding or rising. Houses and

apartments on Harrison & Forest (both sides of Troost) are beginning to rise in value - one house on Harrison (1/2 block from Troost) sold recently for about \$40,000.

Right now 39th & Main doesn't have as strong a merchants assn. as Troost does and unless the Main Street merchants and nearby residents get it together, the businesses forced off Troost may just wind up on Main

One person suggested that a closed shop is preferable to a porno-shop. However to the owner rent is preferable. Therefore if residents want to get rid of porno-shops, etc. existing stores will have to be patronized .

Please send in your comments - they will be passed on to all commercial property owners in the 39th & Main area and also to currently operating businesses. YOUR input is going to help shape the future of the shopping opportunities in our neighborhood. THANK YOU.

FIRE SAFETY

Recently concerns have been expressed about fires in and near Gillham Main.

While there have been about 1/2 dozen, they have started from different causes at different times - there doesn't seem to be any relationship between them.

A cigarette left smoldering, two electrical fires, one an attempt to conceal a burglary, one resulting from personal problems - these have been causes.

It would be wise to check your home for potential fire hazards such as piles of newspapers or rags or flamable liquids.

The K.C. Fire Dept. provides a free fire prevention inspection of your house or apartment. Call the Fire Prevention Office at 274-1478.

(Incidently a rumour has come our way regarding 4001 McGee, a house recently torn down, that a fire had been set there. Several Gillham Main representatives were in the building prior to & during demolition. NEVER AT ANY TIME WAS A FIRE SET THERE. This was a case of poor maintainence of property over several years, a mortgage foreclosure and a decision to demolish rather than repair. The owner offered the house "as is" for \$18,000. It was a poor end for a nice house.)




President's Message



G.M.N.A. has been working with the City for the past year in an effort to have the curbs, sidewalks, and driveway entrances repaired along Warwick Blvd. This project is scheduled for completion this coming Spring. The Association will also be working with the Parks Department to improve the landscaping along Warwick. Both of these steps are a part of a total effort to improve the aesthetic and physical appearance of Warwick.

As a part of this effort to upgrade the major North-South artery through Gillham Main, the Executive Committee voted on November 22 to request that the Traffic Division of the Police Department enforce the ban on trucks which are illegally using Warwick. The Association requests that all residents who operate trucks within the neighborhood comply with the city ordinance dealing with trucks on the city boulevards.

Home burglaries in our neighborhood after beginning with O (zero) in January 1977 have shown as rise in the last half of the year with a high of 21 in September.

We can all turn on a porch light or install a flood light if our yards or nearby areas are dark.

Check with K.C.P.L. on the cost of operating a light and you'll find you are discussing just pennies a day. Compare this with your increased security and peace of mind and you'll probably find it a good investment.

Also, leaving a light on makes the neighborhood feel more welcoming and alive to visitors and new residents.
