Crime is a concern to persons throughout Kansas City. The kind of crime that concerns many people is home break-ins (Apartments or houses) or street robberies.

These kinds of crimes occur most often in poorly lighted areas.

In general the Gillham Main area has

adequate street lighting.

However, many homes have their porches or yards sheltered by desireable trees and bushes. These previde shade, beauty, and so forth. They can also conceal what is happening around your homes.

GILLHAM MAIN STRONGLY RECOMENDS:

(1) Leave a light on at the front door of anytime you go out at night & consider leaving it on all night long every night. Cost is about 2¢ a night.

(2) Always leave a light on in your home whether you are there or not - this

discourages prowlers.

(3) Consider more lights than just at your front door.

At our December meeting we had several guests attending:

City Councilman Joe Shaughnessy discussed Community Development Revenue Sharing. He also discussed the proposed Warwick Blvd. project, and the proposed changes in Westport area zoning.

State Senator Harry Wiggins stopped by to announce that (1) He will open an office within his district; (2) Aides will be available 12 months of the year and he will be when the Senate isn't in session; & (3) he will publish a newsletter for his district.

Mayme Conley, president of the City Wide Coalition of Neighborhoods was present to meet the group and encourage participation in C.W.C.N.O. committees by representatives of member groups.

Keith Zeff-City Planner-explained in detail the rezoning proposals as they affect the Gillham Main area.

G.M.N.A. represents our area through the Association's memberships in: The City Wide Coalition of Neighborhoods; The Westport Community Council: The Westport Plan Commission; & the Broadway Westport Community Development Corporation.

We are here because we think that Gillham Main is a good place to be. We hope you think so too.

CAN YOU LDENTIFY YOUR ROPERTY ! If your home was burgled could you identify your possessions if they were recovered by the police?

To have property returned by the police you have to prove that an individual item is yours not just something like yours.

Without an identification number or a record being kept of the serial number there is almost no way you can identify your property.

The Gillham Main Neighborhood Association has an electric pencil engraver so persons residing in our area may mark & identify their personal property. Rental is 25¢ for 24 hours for members. Deposit is \$2.50.

Incidently the statistics from the police department indicate that about 1 out of every 20 or 25 houses or apartments in our area may experience at least a minor burglary this year. That probably means at least one on YOUR BLOCK.

We strongly advise persons in the Gillham Main area to:

Participate in WHISTLESTOP;
 Mark their property with identification numbers & record serial numbers;

3) Arrange with the Police Department for a free security check of their house or apartment (842-6525 ext. 245 or 246);

4) Notify the Police immediately of anything suspicious - HA1-1500.

Should Gillham Main lobby for an enforceable sidewalk clearing ordinance? So far this winter we know of two broken arms in our area as a result of slick sidewalks and unshoveled snow - one a child, one an older person.

The City Plan Commission has recomended that the City Council approve the rezoning proposed for the Gillham Main area.

The Gillham Main Neighborhood Association has gone on record in the past supporting the rezoning in our area from R4 to R2b.

In the Gillham Main area approximately the area East of Warwick would be changed from Apartment zoning to Duplex zoning.

PORCH LIG

ARE YOU PROTECTED?

Leaving your lights on costs you money. So does insurance. So does a burglary.

Most insurance policies do not return the first \$50 to \$200 of loss. Most residential burglaries in our area average around \$150.

The only way to insure small losses is to prevent the burglary in the first place.

You can turn on some of your lights so that a potential burglar won't be as likely to risk being seen breaking in to your home.

A 40 watt light bulb costs less than 5¢ a night, less than \$1.50 a month to operate dusk to dawn. The average burglary will cost 100 times this monthly cost plus any damage to your home while breaking in.

However - there is a neighbor here who only leaves the porch lights on when they go out. And there is another who turns off all the lights when there is no one home.

We can look out our windows at night and tell if these people are at home or not and so can every burglar who wants to do business in our neighborhood.

The best way to use lights is to leave on every night - all night - 1 or 2 (Front and Back) outdoor lights. In addition you could leave a light (Hall or Bathroom?) on every night inside the house.

First Land Corporation of Overland Park, Kansas is proposing to build a 125 unit hotel on the N.E. corner of 39th & St State Line. With a restaurant included they are suggesting about 140 off street parking places in an already crowded area.

Interstate Brands Corporation, 12 E. Armour is requesting a zoning change on its property so that a sign erected by them in non-conformity with the current zoning may remain.

The rezoning of much of Westport in conformity with current usage and future usage as suggested by the Westport Plan, remains in the City Council Plans and Zoning Committee being throughly discussed and looked into.



Check with your local Hardware Store or other supply source for contractors they will recomend;

(As this article was being written late on a Sunday afternoon, two trash sacks were visible on the curb next door - ripped open

The Association has contacted the City Animal Control Program and asked that they patrol specific areas on Sunday and Monday when the trash is at the curb.

In addition the Association will provide the city with information on any animal running loose regularly and the city will follow up with a call on the owner.

Should you wish to contact the Animal Shelter directly - either to report a loose animal or to look for a missing one the phone number is 861-0123.

DO YOU VALUE YOUR PET?

Recently in the Gillham Main area dogs running loose have been shot and killed by persons unsatisfied by city control of animals.



Crime Prevention in OUR Neighborhood

THE GILLHAM MAIN NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION IS SUPPORTING A CRIME PREVENTION NOW PROGRAM.

Here are the stories of two families gone from their homes for about two weeks.

FIRST FAMILY: This family got information on locks, securing windows, marking their property with an electric engraver, leaving lights on in their homes with an electric timerand so forth.

THEY DID THESE THINGS:
Improved locks;
Put timers on lights;
Put ladders away;
They told all their neighbors - "We're going out of town, call the police if you see anyone at our house."

The Police were called and told that the family would be out of town and all the neighbors would be watching.

One neighbor was given a key for an emergency - which didn't occur - and neighbors and police were told of this.

SECOND FAMILY: "A burglary will never happen to us." They locked their door and went out of town.

No timers.
No lights left on.
No attention to locks.

They didn't tell anyone they were going, or where or for how long.

The FIRST FAMILY was gone three weeks.

The SECOND FAMILY was gone ten days.


